WHO IS ST. MARON?

Around 350 AD, Maron was born in Cyrrhus, a small town near the ancient city of Antioch (near modern day Aleppo, Syria). He was of Syriac ancestry. When he grew up, Maron heard God's call for holiness and perfection. His heart was burning within him. Maron left the world and ascended to the top of Mount Nabo, near Antioch. He lived in the open air, converted an abandoned pagan temple into a church, and spent his time fasting, working, and praying in solitude. He converted many souls and attracted many disciples. Fascinated by his unwavering faith and his profound holiness, devotees from various parts of the region gathered around St. Maron. God bestowed on him the gift of healing, which made his fame spread further in the entire region. St. Maron healed ailments of the body and those of the soul. Despite his growing popularity, he continued to live an ascetic and monastic life, and devoted his existence to preaching the Good News that the God of All People had become a man. St. Maron died around the year 410 AD. His disciples continued his mission, as we do to this day as Maronite Christians. His feast day is on February 9 and it is a Holy Day of Obligation in the Maronite Church. It is also a public holiday in Lebanon.
